## Work Health and Safety Strategic Objectives 2019-2020

The Red Cross Health Safety and Wellbeing direction is aimed at building resilience, reducing risk, injury and illness and providing Red Cross people with a positive, healthy workplace. The National Executive has endorsed the continuing importance of our WHS strategic objectives.

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1. Risk Management	<ul> <li>Managing the risks associated with our work is everyone's responsibility and is based on consultation and raising awareness of the risks;</li> <li>Hazard inspections occur at all Red Cross premises; the frequency of the inspections is dependent on the risk of the site determined by the WHS Team.</li> <li>Sites that are judged to be higher risk will have a higher frequency of inspections</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Assessing and managing risks makes the way we do our work safer for everyone.</li> <li>Systematic site inspections are essential to identifying hazards which we can easily overlook in our daily work.</li> <li>Our risks are understood and their management is consistently applied throughout Red Cross</li> </ul>
2. Consultation	<ul> <li>Everyone builds a 'safety mindset' into their daily work</li> <li>Managers ensure that WHS risk is an agenda item for their meetings</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Consultation is about encouraging us all to proactively contribute to having healthy and safe work environments.</li> <li>Everyone has access to WHS Information when required</li> </ul>
3. Reporting	<ul> <li>All Red Cross people report incidents, near misses and hazards</li> <li>Managers investigate these and take appropriate actions to prevent future harm</li> <li>Appropriate and timely data about WHS incidents and hazards is made available to all Red Cross People and the Board</li> <li>The WHS team communicates safety awareness of onsite &amp; offsite hazards via the SAFE initiative</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Incidents, near misses and hazards are crucial opportunities for Red Cross to learn and improve—they should be discussed, investigated, actioned, and reviewed to avoid a similar issue in the future.</li> <li>This data allows each group to make informed decisions to reduce WHS risks or monitor the reduction of WHS risks.</li> </ul>
4. Building Capability	<ul> <li>Red Cross builds the knowledge, skills and behaviours of Red Cross People to effectively address WHS risks through WHS resources on the Lounge, eLearning and face to face training.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>We want a workforce capable of competently managing WHS risks.</li> </ul>







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
